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A Legacy of Service: A Daughter's Journey to Transform Her Community.

In rural communities across the globe, access to quality education and healthcare remains a significant challenge. Kisoro District is no different. My name is Dr. Joan Bavuga, MSW, DHA. The inspiration to tackle the challenges faced by my community comes from my late father, Mr. John N. Bavuga, a revered educationist whose life's work left an indelible mark on our small, underserved community. Motivated by his passion for change and belief in the power of Education, I founded Bavuga Empowerment Initiative, Inc., a non-profit organization focused on bridging the educational and healthcare resources gap in the same community. My journey reflects the enduring influence of my father's vision, and the profound impact one person can have on the lives of many.

A Father's Influence



The seeds of my aspirations were planted early in my life. My dear father, John Bavuga, was a well-known educator with an unmatched dedication to his students and community members. He was a legend in his time, renowned, and determined to impact our society, sometimes one person at a time. His belief in Education as the key to unlocking individual potential has been proven true through many life transformations.

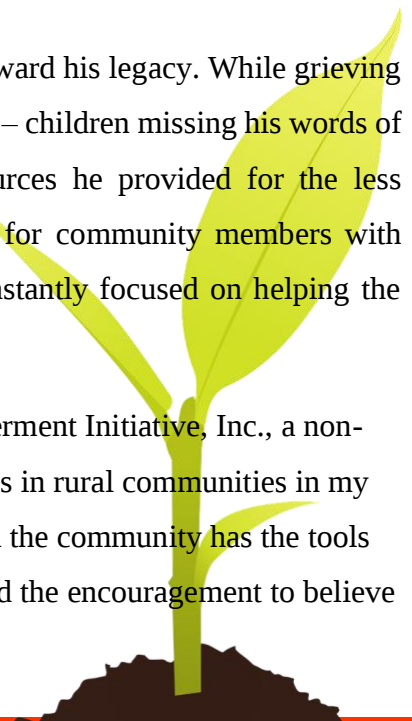


My father, John, worked hard as a primary teacher before getting his degree in Education at Makerere University. He joined the student body as a "Mature Student." He later became a secondary school teacher, then a secondary school headmaster, and, finally, the inspector of schools. During his time in the educational sector, he had 12 children himself but never resisted offering extra help to community children who were orphaned or could not afford school fees. He campaigned tirelessly for better school facilities and teaching materials in the rural area of Kisoro, taught, and made a daily impact.

The Birth of a Vision

After my father's passing, I felt a deep sense of responsibility to carry forward his legacy. While grieving his loss, my reflection was on the gaps that still existed in our community – children missing his words of wisdom about the importance of Education and well-being, the resources he provided for the less privileged: school fees for children, assistance with medical treatment for community members with preventable illness untreated because of inaccessible healthcare. He constantly focused on helping the struggling local families rise out of poverty.

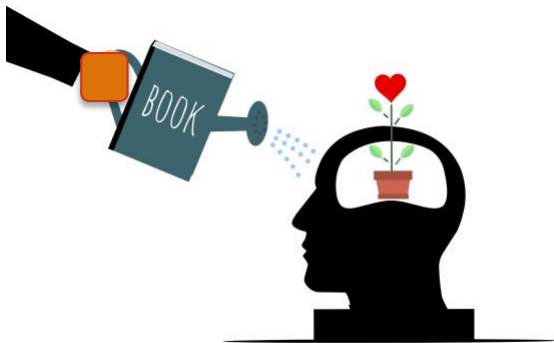
Determined to honor my father's memory, I founded the Bavuga Empowerment Initiative, Inc., a non-profit organization focused on improving Education and Healthcare access in rural communities in my hometown, Kisoro, Uganda. My mission is to ensure that every student in the community has the tools to succeed academically, the healthcare necessary to thrive physically, and the encouragement to believe in oneself despite challenging circumstances.

Bavuga Resource Center will have books for different education levels, computers, and internet access. The resource center will operate as a hub for learning skills to succeed in school and grasp opportunities in the outside world. Bavuga Empowerment Initiative will offer workshops and training for teachers and caregivers

The First Pillar of the Bavuga Empowerment Initiative, Inc., is Education. Drawing on my father's method, I have developed programs addressing immediate needs and long-term systemic change.

- Offer methods to Identify and care for children with special needs, such as learning disabilities
- Reading
- Tutoring and mentorship programs
- Student exchange
- Career development programs.

Health and Well-being Program: A Foundation for Success

**Health and Wellness is the Second
Pillar of the Bavuga Empowerment
Initiative.**



In 2020, my father fell seriously ill and was taken to the Mutolere Hospital for treatment. Upon arrival, doctors diagnosed him with kidney failure, necessitating dialysis treatment. Unfortunately, the hospital lacked a dialysis unit, forcing us to transfer him to the Mbarara referral hospital located six hours away.

At Mbarara Referral Hospital, the estimated cost of dialysis treatment was approximately \$300 per session, with a schedule of three treatments per week. In addition to the treatment cost, my family and I incurred significant costs for hotel accommodations, meals, and travel, as we had to live near the hospital while Daddy received care. While my siblings and I could pool funds to afford these expenses, many families in our community could not have managed if they faced a similar situation.

My father's situation shed light on the broader systemic healthcare issues faced by underserved, typically rural communities - in Kisoro and countrywide.

I am very grateful that we managed to give my father the care he needed and a comfortable end of life. However, each time I think back as a proud and thankful daughter, I also think of how many of my community members have lost their loved ones due to a lack of funds, medical facilities, and end-of-life care that allows a family member to pass on with dignity. Every person yearns for such options, yet it is available to only a few communities.

By establishing Bavuga Empowerment Initiative, a non-profit organization, we will address Health and Wellness challenges to improve health outcomes and reduce the financial burden on families by raising

- The visibility of the simplest healthcare issues that plague small communities in Uganda, such as the community of Kisoro District.
- The funds required to purchase medical equipment, build treatment centers, and attract trained healthcare providers.
- Health advocacy.
- Wellness programs for all ages.
- Improved access to medical care.
- Training for caregivers about the importance of first aid.



Personal and Professional Development Programs:

The Third Pillar of Bavuga Empowerment Initiative

We will offer educational and vocational programs for local leaders, teachers, healthcare workers, and community members. We will focus on

- career development
- study skills
- life skills
- leadership training
- train the trainer
- career planning and development
- computer literacy
- project management

In line with my father's commitment to motivating the Kisoro community one person at a time, we desire to inspire people of all ages through offerings, some in person and others online, by giving goals and the skills to achieve them. A generation of mentored, educated, and inspired individuals are well prepared to take on the challenges of the day and favorably impact future generations to be high-level personal achievers.
